








## Participatory principle and public participation



### Paragraph 23

"All persons, in accordance with their national legislation, shall have the opportunity to participate, individually or with others, in the formulation of decisions of direct concern to their environment, and shall have access to means of redress when their environment has suffered damage or degradation"

### Principle 10

"Environmental issues are best handled with participation of all concerned citizens, at the relevant level. At the national level, each individual shall have appropriate access to information concerning the environment that is held by public authorities, including information on hazardous materials and activities in their communities, and the opportunity to participate in decision-making processes. States shall facilitate and encourage public awareness and participation by making information widely available. Effective access to judicial and administrative proceedings, including redress and remedy, shall be provided"

### KEY IDEAS OF PARTICIPATORY PRINCIPLE

- Three different elements:
  - participation in decision-making process dealing with environmental issues,
  - access to environmental information,
  - access to administrative and judicial proceedings.
    - The three pillars of environmental democracy

**Public consultation (EU Commission)** 



**European citizen initiative (ECI)** 

Provide a description of the initiative in one of the official EU language If criteria are to be met, the Commission registers the initiative

The authorities then have 3 months to verify which statements of support are valid (they will issue the group of organizer with a certificate)

1/ Metting with representatives of the Commission to explain the issues raised in the initiative in detail

2/ Presentation of the initiative at a public hearing at the European Parliament

3/ The Commission will spell out what action it will propose in response to the initiative, and its reasons for taking (or not taking) action



Set up a group of organizer composed of at least 7 EU citizens living in 7 different **EU** countries


Get the support of at least 1 million people, with minimum numbers in at least 7 EU countries (12 months)



The group of organizer has 3 months to submit the initiative to the Commission

## Design of an ECI

- 1/ Proposal topic (context)
- 2/ Requirement (what does citizen want?)
- 3/ Environmental issues, benefits of the initiative, cross-cutting issues (social, cultural, economics...)
- 4/ EU treaty and legislation
- 5/ Board of organizers (representative and members)
- 6/ Legal proposition (article 1....)

Directive (EU) 2020/2184
of the European Parliament
and of the Council

on the quality of water
intended for human consumption

- Multi-level governance = the citizen acts locally, but is aware that his/her action has an echo at European level
- Transnational dimension (group of organizer)
- Complementary to national citizenship = becoming a full citizenship
- Not only an additional right: a right to consider oneself as a citizen of a whole greater than one's nation
- Shift from a "right to" to a "right to be"?
- "a group of European citizens"; "a transnational group of citizens"; "a group of transnational citizens" (?)

• Plaumann case (European Court of Justice, 15 of July 1963, Plaumann / Commission, 25/62, p. 199)
